ACT

to provide for the development of the [Ayurvedic and Unani Tibbi system of medicine]5 and to regulate their practice in [Uttar Pradesh]6.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the development of the [Ayurvedic and Preamble Unani Tibbi systems of medicine]5 [and]7 to regulate the practice thereof [***]8.

It is hereby enacted as follows:

PART I

PRELIMINARY

1. (i) This Act may be Called the U. P. Indian Medicine Act, 1939.

Short title extent and commence-

- (ii) It extends to the whole of [Uttar Pradesh]6 except the Jaunsar Bawar Pargana of the Dehra Dun District and the portion of the Mirzapur district south of the Kaimur Range.
- (iii) Parts I and II of this Act shall come into force on such date9 as the [State] 10 Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, appoint. Part III shall come into force on such date 11 after the expiry of one year from the date on which Parts I and II come into force, as the [State] 10 Government may notify under section 49.

PART II

- 2. In this Ac: unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context :-
- (i) "Board" means the Board of [Ayurvedic and Unani Tibbi systems of medicine] [Unar Pradesh] constituted under section 3.
- (ii) "Ayurvedic and Unani Tibbi systems of medicine" means the Ayurvedic or the Unani Tibbi system of medicine whether supplemented or not by such mode in advances as the Board may from time to time have determined.

Establishment of the Board. 3. The [State]⁵ Government shall, by notification in the official Gazette, establish in the manner provided in sub-section (1) of section 5, a Board to be called the Board of [Ayurvedic and Unani Tibbi systems of medicine]¹ [Uttar Pradesh]² for the purpose of carrying out of the provisions of this Act. Such Board shall be a body corporate and have perpetual succession and a common seal and may by the said name sue or be sued.

Savings for acts done by the existing Board and its dissolution.

- 4. (1) On the date the first Board is constituted under the provisions of this Act, the existing Board of Indian Medicine shall cease to exist and all its assets and liabilities shall devolve upon the Board so constituted.
- (2) All acts begun or completed by the Board of Indian Medicine in existence on the date of the constitution of the first Board shall, in so far as they relate to the functions allotted to the Board constituted under this Act, be deemed to have been begun or performed by the Board constituted under this Act, and such acts may be carried on and completed by or under the authority of the Board so constituted.

Disabilities for continuing as member.

- (1) If any member, during the period for which he has been nominated or elected:—
 - (a) absents himself without sufficient cause from three consecutive ordinary meetings of the Board, or
 - (b) becomes subject to any of the disqualifications mentioned in section 7.
 - (c) being a legal practitioner, appears in any suit or proceeding, civil or criminal, again, the Board, or
 - (d) obtains any employment under the Board or has without the previous sanction of Government acquired directly or indirectly by himself or by a partner any share or interest in any contract with, by or on behalf of the Board.

Provided that before removing a member under this sub-section the Board shall call for his explanation and record its finding thereon.

Filling of casual vacancies in the office of a member or [President]4

- 13. (1) If a member or [President]⁴ of the Board dies or resigns or from any cause whatsoever ceases to be a member or [President]⁴, as the case may be, the vacancy so created shall be filled by a fresh election or nomination as the case may be within such period as may be prescribed.
- (2) The term of office of a member or [President]⁴ elected or nominated to fill up the vacancy mentioned in sub-section (1) shall be the remainder of term of office of the member or [President]⁴ in whose place he has been so elected or appointed:

Provided that in the case of an elected member, if the vacancy is for a period of six months or less, the Board may direct that the vacancy be left unfilled until the next general election.

Term of office of a member. 14. Save as otherwise provided in this part, the term of office of the [President]⁴ or a member of the Board shall be three years:

[Provided that the State Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, extend from time to time the term of the President and all members of the Board so, however, that the total extension does not in the aggregate, exceed two years]⁵.

No disqualification of or defect in the election or nomination of any Validity of person acting as a member of the Board or as the [President] or presiding authority of a proceedings. meeting shall be deemed to vitiate any act or proceedings of the Board in which such person has taken part if the majority or persons who took part in such act or proceedings were duly qualified members of the Board.

Registrar and other officers and servants of the Board.

- 24. (1) The Board shall, with the previous approval of State Government appoint a Registrar why shall be the Secretary to the Board. The Registrar shall receive such salary and allow: ces as may be prescribed by the rules. The [President] may from time to time grach him leave and may temporarily appoint a person to act in his place. Any person duly appointed to act as Registrar shall be deemed to be the Registrar for all purposes of this Act.
- (2) Any order of Board appoining, punishing of removing the Registrar from his office shall be subject to the approval of the [State]² Government.
- (3) The Boa: may appoint such other officers and servants as may be necessary for carrying out the purposes of this Act:

Provided that se number and designations of such officers and servants, their salaries and allowances shall be subject to the previous approval of the [State]² Government:

Provided also that the power of the Board to punish, dismiss, discharge and remove any officer or ervant of the Board shall be subject to any rules framed by the [State]² Government is this behalf.

Maintenance of register.

Duties of Registrar.

27. (1) Every person possessing the qualifications men: med in the Schedule Persons entitled shall, subject to the provisions contained in or made under this / ", and upon payment to be registered. of such fees, whither in lump sum or periodically, as may be prescribed, be entitled on an application made to the Registrar, to have his name entered in the register. When the name of a person has been registered in accordance with the provision aforesaid he shall be granted a certificate in the prescribed form.

- (2) Any person aggrieved by the order of the Registrae refusing to enter his name in the Register or to make any entry therein may, within ninty days of such refusal, appeal to the Board.

Amendment of Schedule.

- (a) that a title or degree granted or qualification certified by a University, Medical Corporation, examining body or other institution in India is a sufficient guarantee that person holding such a title or degree of qualification possess the knowledge or skill requisite for the efficient gractice of [Ayurvedic or Unani Tibbi system of medic.ne]2 or
- (b) that such title, degree or qualification is not a sufficient guarantee as aforesaid,

- (a) to furnish such reports, returns or other information as the Board may require to enable it to judge of the efficiency of the inso-etion given therein in medicine, surgery or midwifery; and
- (b) to provide facilities to enable a member of the doard deputed by the Board in this behalf to be present at the examination field by such Medical Corporation examining body or other institution.

Every person who applies to have his name entered in the register of Vaidyas [or]⁴ Hakims [* * *]³ must satisfy the [Registrar]⁵ at he is possessed of some degree, title or qualification specified in the Schedule; 1 to he must inform the Registrar of the date on which he obtained the degree, title or qualification which entitled him to claim registration under this Act, and shall furnish any other information required by the Registrar in order to enable him discharge his duties under the Act.

Power of Board to prohibit entry in, or to direct removal from. the register. etc.

- 31. (1) The Board may prohibit the atry in, or order the removal from, the register of the name of any Vaidya or Hakim :-

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the U.P. Indian Medicine Act, 1939 for the purposes hereinafter appearing.

It is hereby enacted in the English Year of the Republic of Indian as follows:-

- (1) This A:t may be called the U.P. Indian Medicine (Second Amendment)
 Act, 1956.
 - (2) It shall come into force at once.
- 2. In sub-section (1) of section 5 of the U.P. Indian Medicine Act, 1939, for clause (iii) the following shall be substituted:—

"(iii) one member each from a University established by Law in Uttar Pradesh and having a Faculty concerned with Ayurvedic or Unani Tibbi System of Medicine to be elected in the manner prescribed by the Faculty."

It is hereby enacted in the wenty-sixth Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

- 1. This Act may be called The Uttar Pradesh Indian Medicine Short title. (Amendment) Act, 1975.
- In section 2 of the U.P. I: dian Medicine Act, 1939 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act), after clause (iv), the following clause shall be inserted, section 2 of the U.P. Act 10 of 1939.
 - "(iv-a) 'Para-medical con e', means a course of study approved by the Board for the training of companders, nurses and mid-wives in the Ayurvedic or Unani-Tibbi Systems of me cine and surgery:"
- 3. In section 5 of the Princip 1 Act in sub-section (1), for clauses (iii) to (v) Amendment of the following clauses shall be substituted, namely:—

 section 5.
 - "(iii) one member each from a University established by law in Uttar Pradesh and having a Faculty concerned with the Ayurvedic or Unani-Tibbi Systems of medicine to be elected in the prescribed manner by such Faculty";
 - (iv) two members representing Ayurvedic Educational Institutions of Uttar Pradesh to be elected in the prescribed manner by the teachers of such Institutions as are affiliated to a University established by law in Uttar Pradesh;
 - (v) one member representing Unani Educational Institutions of Uttar Pradesh to be elected in the prescribed manner, by the teachers of such institutions as are affiliated to a University established by law in Uttar Pradesh.
 - 4. In section 36 of the principal Act :-

- (c) for clause (7), the following clause shall be substituted, namely :-
 - "(7) to perform such other functions for the development of Ayurvedic and Unani systems of Medicine and Surgery as may be consistent with the provisions of the Act";
- (d) clause (9) shall be omi ed.

 - (i) for clauses (a) to (c), the following clauses shall be substituted namely:

 - (b) to hold examinations of persons who shall have pursued a ceruse of study in a training centre recognised by the Board;
 - c) to exercise general supervision over the residential and disciplinary arrangements made by the training centres recognised by the Board and to make arrangement for promoting the health are general welfare of their students."
 - (ii) for clauses (e) and (f), the following clause shall be substituted, namely:—
 - "(e) to clause inspection of training centres recognised by the Board; and
 - (f) to make recommendations to the Board for the accord of recognition to or the suspension or withdrawal of recognition of training centres."
 - (iii) clause (g) shall be omitted; and
 - (b) after sub-section (1) as so re-numbered, the following sub-section shall be inserted, namely:—
 - the Registrar shall function as the Secretary of the Faculty."

 - "36-C. In the event of disagreement between the Faculty and the Board on any matter reterred to in section 36-B, a reference shall be made by the Board to the State Government and the decision of the State Government shall be final."

 - "(1) (a) conditions on which institutions may be recognised for the purposes of registration under section 28;
 - (b) The admission of Trainees to the Training centres recognised by the Board;

- (c) the conditions under which trainees shall be admitted to the diploma and certificate courses and to the examinations of the Board, and shall be eligible for the grant of such diplomas and certificates;
- (d) the conditions of residence of the trainees in the training centres recognised by the Board and the levying of fees for such residence;
- (e) the number, qualifications and emoluments of teachers of the training centres recognised by the Boarc;
- (f) the fees to be charged for courses of study in such training centres and for admission to the examinations, diplomas and certificates of the Board;
- (g) the conditions and mode of appointment and duties of examiners and the conduct of examinations:

Provided that in framing regulations, the Board shall take into consideration the financia and other existing conditions of the training centres generally:

Provided further that no egulation shall be framed under any of the subclauses (a) to (g) except upon the recommendations to be made in such manner as may be prescribed by the Faculty."

9. For section 40 of the principal Act, the following section shall be substituted, namely:—

40. Except with the speci is sanction of the State Government no person other than a Vaidya or Hakin who has qualified himself or hereself from an institution affiliated to the Board or who holds a degree in Ayurvedic or Unani-Tibbi Systems of medicine from a University established by law in Uttar Pradesh, and is a domiciled resident of this State shall be competent to hold an appointment as medical officer of health or as physician or other medical officer in an Ayurvedic or i mani hospital, infirmay, dispensary or lying-in hospital maintained by or under the control of the State Government or a localy authority:

Provided that Vaidyas and Hakims in the employee of the State Government or a local authority specified above on the date on which this Act comes into force shall continue to hold the said appointment".
